

The head is set on a short very strong and well developed neck. The body is muscular, cobby with broad chest, shoulders and back are strong and solid. Legs are short and strong with round and firm paws. Tail is short and thick rounded at the tip and well furnished.

Coat long to medium-long standing away from the body. Short on the face and gradually increasing in length on the cheeks. Well developed frill and breeches. Texture is firm, double, dense and plush with undercoat which gives the coat distinct body.

Every hair should be uniform in colour down to the roots, except in tabby and/or silver varieties. Remarks: seasonal changes in coat density, length and texture are permitted. Allowance should be made in kittens because the colour takes longer time to develop.
